Well, here we go again – but with a major milestone in play. The September 2011 Kutztown Radio Show, (September 16-17, 2011), will be the 25th radio show sponsored by the DVHRC.

Early table reservations indicate another sellout of what has become the premier radio event of the year.

The executive committee wanted to recognize this milestone by providing a “giveaway” for dealers and attendees. A number of ideas were discussed at the June meeting, including an inexpensive Digital Multi-meter with the DVHRC logo.

While probably the most appropriate item, one negative was clear: getting the DVHRC logo on the front of the meter was problematic. There’s almost no “real estate” for a logo on the front of the meter. Putting our logo on the back or the box would greatly reduce the effect of our logo.

The board then decided on a beer/soda/coffee mug with DVHRC and Renninger's logos, as well as the date of the 25th. See pictures that follow.

The board also plans to have a 1-page, front and back laminated sheet with helpful radio information

such as resistor values, capacitor values, etc. It is hoped that radio collectors would find this useful and keep it on their bench – another way of keeping Kutztown and DVHRC in their thoughts.
