APRIL 2009 MEETING NOTES AND MINUTES

As I'm writing this we are at "Kutztown XX minus 7 days and counting..." Things are building up for the event. We'll have Kutztown University's radio station on site doing a remote. We have the possibility of Channel 10 (Philadelphia) doing remote coverage of the event. The Antique Radio Forum has been alive with chats about the event.

There was one just open spot in the main pavilion as of our last meeting, so we expect a good crowd. The sign-up sheet for covering the club table was circulated at the meeting. We can always use some additional help for the club table. The hours are from 12 noon on Friday to roughly 7 PM Friday evening. It will pick up again Saturday morning at 7 AM and run until the auction begins around noon. Please note there will be a "high end" auction on Friday evening beginning after the dinner. We will need help for Friday's auction as well as Saturday's.

We will also see the return of the "debris field." Items, donated to the club, not worthy of auction, will be placed there and anyone can "buy it now" for a buck or two. Though the club table has published hours of operation for the club table, the meet itself starts when the first vendor arrives! It's over when the Saturday

auction runs out of steam - so come early, stay late, and most of all - have a good time.

The club received a nice "Thank you" note from the Southern Leigh Public Library. This was for sponsoring the old time radio show there recently. The club has re-stocked its capacitor supply, so bring your list of what you need. The club's tube collection has been re-organized and it ready to supply all you tubes needs. Prices are now dependent on the particular tube you need. Prices are based on AES price list and are discounted. All our tubes have been tested. Thanks go out to Dave Dean for organizing the tube supply. He'll be on site, covering the "tube table" during the meet.

We will have "raffle radio" on display, as well as, tickets for sale during the show. An ever popular part of the show - don't forget to get your tickets for this radio.

And it that's not enough to fill a meeting, we had a technical presentation by Lewie Newhard. Lewie challenged members to think of Kutztown as a "treasure hunt." Lewie gave out a list of "must have" items for collectors wanting to repair/restore radios.

Starting with the Simpson 260 VOM and continuing through parts, tools, solder, test equipment and more,

Lewie gave us the start of a radio repair shop. As other chimed in the list grew, so I think that Kutztown will be a chance for many who are just getting started in the hobby to assemble their "tool kit."

The tech talks in the future will give practical advise on how fix the radio, align it and get in good working shape.

Here is a list of items to hunt for on your treasure hunt: Simpson 260 VOM or equivalent - an analog meter, sensitivity 20 ohms/volt - not digital as they will not read properly. All old service literature includes voltage readings made with this type of meter - the newer ones will not load the circuit; therefore, giving incorrect readings.

Next is an isolation transformer. Very important when working on AC/DC all-American fives. A VARIAC - remember that VARIAC's are not isolation transformers!

Repair parts: capacitors, resistors, if coils, tubes, volume controls, and pilot lamps. An old radio (like you might find on the debris field) can make a excellent source of parts, though I'd get new capacitors from the club.

In addition, it never hurts to have a stock of miscellaneous hardware: nuts, bolts, screws, washers, and

spacers. Don't forget dial-cord!

Soldering equipment: 25 to 40 watt soldering iron or a soldering station, a Weller- style gun for heavy jobs, and solder.

Other pieces of test equipment: Signal generators, audio and RF; tube testers, and a VTVM. Oscilloscopes round out the list.

Assorted hand tools, service literature, a good tube manual can be found at the meet. Service literature may also be found on line.

I'll close this list with jumper cables, service cement, and alcohol - for cleaning!

There will be more on this at future meetings.

Our usual auction was a little shorter than usual, many saving stuff for Kutztown. The next meeting will be on May 12th, at the Telford Community Center at 7:30 PM. See you there.

Information for consignors

- Auction is run by Richard Estes of Estes Auctions.
- Auction is located inside Renninger's complex. (see map)
- Open to vintage radios, televisions and related items with an expected bid value of \$25 or more. Estes and the DVHRC reserves the right to refuse items for any reason (examples: low quality, low interest, poor condition, too many items for one seller, too many total items in the auction).
- Commission is 10% of the final auction price. Checks for total sales price less commission will be mailed to consignors within 3 weeks after the show.
- Items can be dropped off 4-6pm Friday at the indoor auction hall.

Information for buyers

- All items are sold as-is.
- Items can be previewed 6-7pm Friday.
- To bid you must register and have a bidder number. Registration is \$3 and is 6-7pm Friday.
- Items will be held until paid for. Payment is cash or approved check.
- No buyer's premium.

DVHRC Auction - Saturday Noon

Information for consignors

- Auction is run by the DVHRC and is located at the DVHRC table (center of the main pavilion).
- Open to vintage radios, televisions and related items. Items can be consigned or donated to the DVHRC for auction. Place stickers with your bidder/seller number on consigned items. Place donation stickers on donated items.
- To consign you must be registered and have a bidder/seller number. Registration is \$1. The number is used to both buy and sell.
- Register at the DVHRC table (center of the main pavilion) at any time.
- Reserve prices may be specified. Place reserve stickers on these items.
- Donated items will be sold as "Buy-it-Now" or auctioned at the discretion of the DVHRC.
- Listen for announcements Saturday morning when to bring items to the DVHRC table (center of the main pavilion).
- Commission is 10% with a maximum of \$5 per item.
- Checks for total sales less commission will be mailed within 3 weeks of the end of the show.
- Unsold items must be removed by the consignors

Information for Buyers

- You must be registered and have a bidder/seller number. The number is used to both buy and sell.
- Register at the DVHRC table at any time (center of the main pavilion). Registration is \$1.
- No buyer's premium
- Items must be paid for before leaving auction area.
- Payment is cash or approved check.
