
Several photos were shot of the tube chart for posterity.


This is your chance to help to make *your club's* meetings more interesting. Since this is my idea, I'll jump in and do January 2008.

Low Voltage by Old 6L6

How low can you go in voltage and still get good radio reception? Collins had a version of their 390 series that ran on 28 volts. It is a great performer. Years ago, 32 volt farm radios were great radios. Philoo had a farm set with an odd power plug, parallel 48 audio tubes and no power transformer.

I once cut the voltage on an S40 Hallicrafters to 40 volts and still had good reception. 7m a of plate current to the 6F6 output. It sure was quiet radio off-station. Total set drew 18m a. In Europe, cars are switching to 42 volt batteries. No doubt they will be here soon. Then we will have a substitute for the expensive 45 volt "B" batteries. Savings in heavy copper wire was the aim of the 42 volt systems. LED's will soon be used in everything but headlights and may never need replacing.
