Meeting Notes and Minutes


Dave Snellman reporting






Old 6L6 says;

The great depression of 1929 was a great boom for the radio industry.

- 1 People had little money to spend, but radio was cheap entertainment.
- 2 Montgomery Ward sold type 30 tubes for 29 cents each.
- 3 The radio amateur ranks went from 22,000 to 130,000 in three years.
- 4 Sears sold a 5 tube radio for \$5.95.
- 5 Sreeen grid tubes and the superhet were both great advancements.
- 6 Local newspapers had a radio section with data and circuits.
- 7 Home build was common.
- 8 Mail order catalogs and cheap postage were the radio store back then.
- 9 Our radio was home made with 3 tubes. At noon my dad listened to national farm shows for egg and potato prices.
- 10 At night it was comedy and news shows.
- 11 Theose regen sets produced a lot of signal.
- 12 Penn Jersey, Pep Boys, Woolworth and Mc'Crory's 5 and 10 stores had radio stuff.
- 13 Many new radio set manufacturers came into being and now we are collecting those sets.

When I was a boy of 9 years, I built my first 1-tube and was hooked. Radio as you know is a disease and once infected, not easily cured. Thats why there are recovery support groups like DVHRC. See you there.
