In our "show and tell" venue we saw a 1939 Silvertone, model 6322, presented by Lewie Newhard. It's a six-tube-superhet. In keeping with the holiday, the wooden cabinet has hearts carved on each side.



As mentioned in last month's Oscillator, Dan Schwartzman showed off some more World War II era "radio" maps. Offered by various oil companies, they gave a global view of the world during that era.

Ray Scheffy showed a brief video of his collection. This was originally taped and shown on a local TV station.

Before our technical presentation started, we had a nice open discussion of items of interest to our members in attendance. We used our "whiteboard" to list members' questions and needs. One major change was the consensus to have the regular monthly meeting during the Kutztown months. We have been passing on those meetings to concentrate on Kutztown, but vox populi wins. We will be in Telford in May and September.

Mike Lobus and Dan Schwartzman gave the technical presentation this evening. Safety and radio repair was the topic. As many of us collect "All-America Fiver's," Mike and Dan chose them to point out the potential (no pun intended) dangers when working on these sets. In these sets, the chassis is ground. Older style AC plugs were not polarized, so it's easy to



chassis is ground. Older style AC plugs were not polarized, so it's easy to plug the grounded side into the "hot" side of the AC line. Coming contact with the chassis or even the control knob shafts could result in a shock — or worse. They outlined steps to take to minimize your risk, including how to do a simple test to determine if the chassis is "hot." One item they recommended to add to your repair bench was an isolation transformer. It's a good practice to use one of these when working on AC-DC sets. Another good idea is to have a mat on your bench and on the floor in front of your bench. These will help further isolate you from the chance of coming in contact with the AC line.

The request for survey results have been too few to give a good picture of the feelings of the members. We will wait for another month to see if more arrive to make a consensus. The meeting drew to an end with our regular auction. Donated items, mainly tubes and parts, netted \$40 for the club treasury.

Our next meeting will be on **Tuesday, March 14**, 2006 at the Telford Community Center. The meeting starts at 7:30 PM. We look forward to seeing you there.
