

DX'ing the Airwayes for November

NOVEMBER 2,1920 Westinghouse Station 8YK (KDKA), Pittsburgh begins regularly scheduled programming with returns of the Harding-Cox presidential election.

NOVEMBER 28, 1925 A radio institution is born: WSM, Nashville launches "The Grand Ole Opry". Network broadcasts begin on NBC in October '39.

NOVEMBER 1,1926 RCA links WEAF and WJZ, organizing the basis of NBC.

NOVEMBER 11, 1929 CBS premiere's the long-running family drama "The Goldbergs".

NOVEMBER 18, 1929 Before a meeting of the Institute of Radio Engineers, Dr. V.K. Zworykin demonstrates his cathode ray television receiver.

NOVEMBER 27, 1930 Listeners are introduced to the dramatic anthology, "The First Nighter Program", a radio staple on all three major networks through the 1954 season.

NOVEMBER 1,1931 Two additional NBC networks are established on the West Coast: The Orange and the Gold.

NOVEMBER 6,1932 NBC begins counting down the hits on "The Manhattan Merry-Go-Round". The following evening, CBS airs the first outer space adventure of "Buck Rogers in the 25th Century".

NOVEMBER 18, 1932 Chevrolet sponsors the NBC musical variety hour "Presenting Al Jolson".

NOVEMBER 15, 1933 Under revised FRC regulations, WGN, Chicago, WBZ, Boston and WHAM, Rochester are green-lighted for 50 kW operations.

NOVEMBER 1,1934 After years of litigation, Westinghouse station KYW moves from Chicago to Philadelphia, taking its "West of the Mississippi" call sign with it.

NOVEMBER 1,1937 NBC debuts the action-packed juvenile serial "Terry and the Pirates"





NOVEMBER 6, 1939 Hedda Hopper's first gossip-fest on CBS.

NOVEMBER 20, 1939 Later a daytime TV classic, "Young Dr. Malone" starts it's 21 year radio run on the Blue network.

NOVEMBER 21, 1944 Singing cowboy Roy Rogers conquers another medium on Mutual with a Western-variety-drama program

NOVEMBER 5, 1950 Fighting the radio "talent raid" by rival CBS and the onslaught of television, NBC launches the ill-fated variety spectacular, "The Big Show". (With an estimated weekly budget of \$100,000, it was a hefty price to pay to try and save a dying medium).

NOVEMBER 19, 1951 Reported to be "hazy but viewable," Bing Crosby Enterprises announces development of a system for recording sight and sound on magnetic tape.

NOVEMBER 17, 1952 CBS cuts the ribbon on Television City in Hollywood.

NOVEMBER 7, 1955 WNB Q-TV, now WMAQ-TV, Chicago becomes the first all-color television station.

NOVEMBER 20, 1961 Engineers at ABC-TV develop a process for immediate show-motion playback of video tape recordings.

NOVEMBER 22, 1965 Industry pioneer Dr. Allen B. Dumont dies at 64.

NOVEMBER 13, 1993 The first ever DVHRC swapmeet held in the parking lot of North Penn Amusements in Souderton, PA.
