## SEPTEMBER AUCTION REVIEW Mike Koste

The membership should be praised for contributing a wide variety of "quality' items to the Sept. 13 equipment auction. Three tables were packed with 87 lots, with something for practically every collecting interest. Although some offerings did not meet their reserves, over half the inventory changed hands. It's safe to assume that, with Rochester over, we'll see more of the same at the Oct. 11 meeting.

Along with a number of fairly common '50s and '60s table radios, miscellaneous parts and box lots of tubes, big-ticket items of the night included a very desirable Tarleton transistor with detachable antenna, a white Crosley D25E clock-radio in fine condition, a pair of interesting home-built three-dialers, an unusual Mitchell 1402 table radio, a super-clean '53 Silvertone 2016 in ivory plastic with criss-cross grille, a pair of Sinclair gas-pump transistors (probably the most desirable of the gas pumps since Sinclair isn't around anymore), a very desirable Crosley 11-116U (despite a corner chip and lack of knobs), and a pristine Spica ST-600 in bright blue.

The DVHRC treasury benefits from all auction sales, charging a 10% commission on items up to \$50 and a flat \$5 for sales over \$50.

#### **AUCTION AT CHAMBERSBURG, OCT. 15**

The following are highlights of material catalogued for auction at Chambersburg, PA on Saturday, Oct. 15. (Gateway Gallery, 643 Kriner Rd, 0.5 mi from Exit 5 of I-81), [717] 263-5076.) This is a huge auction, with 521 lots from the collection of Jack Hortman. Model numbers listed are fairly accurate (but there are typos in the catalog). Many of the radios are said to be recapped and/or working.

Lest anyone think he'll be the sole bidder on that Rider's set, etc. - the seller is a member of the Mid--Atlantic club and this auction has been announced at a recent MAARC meeting. Still, there's enough material to entertain a whole group of buyers.

#### MEET REPORT: AWA - ROCHESTER

September's annual Antique Wireless Association event at Rochester is in the "golden glow" phase. Numerous DVHRC luminaries attended. At minimum, they were: Jim Amici, Pete & Jan Grave, John Kern, Frank Maggiore, Bob Masterson, Lewis Newhard, John Okolowicz, Bill Overbeck, Terry Skelton, Ludwell Sibley, John Terrey, and Bill Wade. Flea-market weather was glorious on Wednesday and Thursday, wet the next two days. Although this event is not a heavy-hitter for transistor collectors, Bill Overbeck reported capture of a Toshiba TH666, Toshiba 7TP31 (new-in-box), and a Zenith Interoceanic. special theme in the talks and Equipment Contest was dual: the 150th anniversary of the telegraph, and World War II radio. In the Equipment Contest, Lloyd Jury of Lancaster "stopped the show" with a massive display of historic radar tubes and other components. Copies of the handout from the Sibley talk on collecting/restoring WW II military equipment are available from your friendly editor.

John Okolowicz received AWA's Taylor Award for television history, a result of his excellent article on Philco TV designs in May's *Old Timer's Bulletin*. Our "neighbor" Ed Lyon of MAARC got the AWA Houck Award for Documentation, based on his series of historical articles in the MAARC newsletter.

The auctions this year had lots of high-quality material; total sales were about \$55,000, which is about last year's total but without the two estates that swelled the 1993

gear. "Biggest deals" were: a spherical Audion, *filament condition unstated*, \$900; a rotating Geissler-tube display, \$1550; a (British) single-needle telegraph set, \$1550; two fine RCA 77DX mikes, \$1050 and \$1300 respectively; a Radio Glow leaded-glass table set, \$2300; a (Swedish) Ericsson Morse telegraph ink recorder, \$2300; and a small De Forest Interpanel set, \$1300. It appears that British and European attenders are answering the big U. S. demand for foreign equipment by bringing some along - there were numerous crystal sets, a Luftwaffe receiver and a Wehrmacht direction finder, several foreign tubes, etc.

Highlights of the auctions are listed beginning on the next page. They are given here because AWA provides individual auctions for specific classes of material - particularly communications equipment, literature, and tubes - and seems to auction more key-and-telegraph gear than any other event. Thus Rochester results are unusually significant for collectors in these areas. - LAS
