
Meeting notes By Dave Snellman

The total auction sales were \$1783.50 from a total of 203 lots sold. \$980.78 will be paid to those who consigned items to the auction. The club took in \$108.98 in commissions. The bottom line is we cleared around \$1130 for our efforts. We've rounded the amount we'll donate up to \$1200.00.

Thanks go out to all the vendors and their donations, the buyers, and the members who helped at the club table or at the auction. We could not have had a successful meet without you. Your efforts helped those whose whole lives have been uprooted by nature's furry.
